### H.2. Report from California School Employees Association (CSEA)

#### Minutes:

CSEA President Wayne Harris thanked Superintendent Armstrong for the California Labor-Management Initiative (CA LMI) invitation that he attended along with Superintendent Armstrong and WEA President Bobby Rogers. The CA LMI demonstrated to attendees how they can improve their communication skills and resolve their issues effectively. CSEA and WEA have decided to initiate meetings once a month, starting in May, a meeting that President Blanco III and Superintendent Armstrong will attend. They plan to work out some pending issues, and commended the Board for the increase in custodial hours.

# H.3. Report from Student Board Members

#### Minutes:

Cache Creek High School Alternate Student Board Member Jenifer Orozco reported that their fourth quarter began on March 21, and that they had their Midpoint Credit Check that day. On April 6, students took their Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) test, and the Army staff returned on April 27 to provide the students with their test results. She shared that many students attended the Cesar Chavez

Youth Leadership Conference on April 9 at UC Davis. On March 30, the Veteran's Project presentation was held in Mr. Poe's classroom, who is their World History and U.S. History teacher. The students enjoyed listening to the veterans that went to visit and were glad to be able to ask questions. Also, on April 20, author Reyna Grande, who wrote "Across a Hundred Mountains", visited and read her book in various classes. Students enjoyed her company and asked her questions. Ms. Orozco thanked Trustee Dr. Rodriguez for welcoming Ms. Grande at their school. Their local Cambridge Junior College presented information to students on April 20 on how they could become Nurse Assistants during an eight-week summer program. They held their Honor Roll Awards on April 22 with 20 students earning 20 – 24.5 credits for Honor Roll and 22 students earning 25 or more credits for Principal's Honor Roll. Three students got certificates for having 100% perfect attendance. On April 25, a Woodland Community College outreach specialist visited their school to perform college assessments for the students that have completed their enrollment applications. Cache Creek High School has 37 graduates to date, and they continue to be present, positive, and productive. Ms. Orozco announced a few upcoming events, such as the following: Open House on May 4, All Leaders Must Serve (ALMS) Graduation on May 5, and School Site Council and ELAC Meetings on May

Pioneer High School Student Board Member Sukhi Chima reported that they are proud of SkillsUSA and Pioneer High School student Lauren Millang for being the State FFA Association Vice President. She shared that Ms. Millang has delayed one year of college so that she can take the Vice President paid position. Students are preparing for the Advanced Placement (AP) testing. The Associated Student Body (ASB) made Lucky Charm bags for those students preparing for the AP tests. Smart Balance testing for Juniors has gone well. On the previous day, Seniors had the opportunity to attend two live court cases. Senior Prom will be in two weeks. On May 4, Pioneer High School held their Spring Fling Open House. Spring Sports are finishing up, and Eric Livingston will be going to Sections.

Woodland High School Student Board Member Sarah Gatie reported that the Associated Student Body (ASB) Officers and Class Officers were recently elected by the student body. That weekend, the annual school musical will perform, and will continue until May 8. That year the theme is "Once Upon a Mattress". The Advanced Placement (AP) government class held a Mock Congress with their teacher Mr. Marin. The Student Store began selling Country 4 Coaches tickets and has been having successful sales. The Woodland High School Tri-County Conference (TCC) Swimming Championship team met the following day. The score for the girls' varsity team was 6-0 and the score for the boys' varsity team was 5-1. On May 14, the Senior and Junior prom will be held at Hotel Woodland. Finally, the Juniors have finished with their Smarter Balanced Assessment Consortium (SBAC) testing that day; they have been testing for two hours daily for four days.
