CSEA President Todd Freer reported that they reached a two-year agreement with the District that day. Unit members will vote on the two-year agreement in August, at the beginning of the 2018-19 school year. He announced that the Supreme Court ruled in Janus v. AFSCME that nonunion workers cannot be forced to pay fees to public sector unions. He stated that CSEA has been preparing for this at the state level for many years, and their chapter has nearly 100% of members. He shared that he will be attending the CSEA Annual Conference in July.
